Officers Voting
On Primary Election Day.

It was brought to the attention of the Board that many of the officers of various police districts had requested to know from their respective captains whether they would be permitted to vote on Election Day April 7, 1903.

The Board directed that the Marshal be instructed to inform the captains that they may tell the officers attached to their respective districts, should they inquire as to their right to vote on the election day referred to, to say that the law gives the members the right to vote on the election day mentioned, and the Board is not authorized to interfere in the matter.
