R.L.Showacre, 2104 Edmondson avenue,
Re. Conduct of Negroes Edmondson Avenue.

In the matter of the complaint of R. L. Showacre, 2104 Edmondson avenue, with respect to the conduct of negroes in the neighborhood of Edmondson avenue bridge over the tracks of the P.B. & W. R.R. as referred to in the proceedings of July 5, 1910, a communication, as follows, was received from the Supt. of Lamps & Lighting. Said communication was read and ordered filed, see Exhibit No. 2992.

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter under date of July 1st., conveying to me the instructions of the Board of Police Commissioners, in the matter of the complaint of Mr. R. L. Showacre, 2401 Edmondson avenue, with regard to the improper conduct on the part of negroes in the vicinity of the bridge over the tracks of the P.B. & W. R.R., at Edmondson avenue, and enclosing a copy of a letter from that gentleman addressed to the Board, all of which have been carefully noted.

I felt quite certain at the time I received your letter that the bridge in question was lighted in a manner necessary for the public convenience, and a very careful investigation made by the department since, confirms that impression.
