

In the matter of bill of Dr. H. E. Zepp, \$18.50, for professional services to Patrolman Francis J. Thurley, who was injured June 9th., 1910, by having his horse fall with him on Calvert street near Lexington.

Inasmuch as Patrolman Francis J. Thurley failed to ask for the services of one of the Police Physicians, which he had the right to do under the law and the rules of the department, but elected to employ another physician to attend to his injuries, the Board refused to pay the bill of Dr. Zepp's, hereinbefore referred to.
