Trials.

Patrolman Albert Lang, Western District, was tried upon charge, as follows, found guilty of the said charge, fined \$50. ordered deprived of ten days leave of absence and transferred to B. Division:

C h a r g e :

"Drinking intoxicating liquor, while on active duty, at 4:30 a.m., July 14, 1910, at saloon of John T. Leary, 506 W. Lexington street."

Probationer Henry J. Fangman, Southwestern District, was tried upon charge, as follows, found guilty of the said charge, fined \$25., ordered deprived of 19 days leave of absence, and transferred to another part of the Southwestern District.

C h a r g e :

"Conduct unbecoming an officer by going to the house of Annie Wilhelm, 828-1/2 Frederick avenue, July 9th., 1910, about 12:30 a.m., while on leave of absence and in citizen's clothing, using improper language to Annie Wilhelm and threatening bodily harm to Frederick Erb, being under the influence of liquor at the time."

It was ordered in this connection that Probationer Henry J. Fangman be warned that if he should be found guilty in the future of any serious offense he will be dismissed from the service.
