

Applicant Re-instated.

In the matter of Applicant Charles L. Tunstall, nominated by the Board of Police Examiners, under date of December 29, 1906, and who was rejected by the Board of Police Commissioners January 14, 1907, because the said applicant at that time failed to pass the required physical examination.
