A communication, as follows, was received, read and ordered filed without action. (See Exhibit No. 3007.)

"Baltimore, Md., July 14th., 1910.

To The Honorable,

The Board of Police Commissioners, CITY.

Gentlemen:-

In yesterday's evening "Sun" my name was again mentioned in connection with the Boland divorce case. It is embarrassing to myself and family to have the newspapers repeatedly connect me with this case, and I take this method to state to your Honorable Board, and through you, to the press and public, that I took no part either for or against Mr. or Mrs. Boland in this case. Anyone who reports that I rendered service as detective to either Mr. or Mrs. Boland in their case utters a deliberate, malicious falsehood.

At the time the Referee was taking evidence in this Boland divorce case I was summoned as a witness and at that time I made special request to the attorneys in the case that a copy of my testimony be given to the Police Board. This they promised to do. I court, either through your Board or the Grand Jury, the fullest investigation and, in justice to me, I hope that some immediate official action will be taken towards this end.
