Board met; present, Messrs. Wheltle and Tome.

The minutes of the previous meeting, Thursday, July 14, 1910,
were read, approved and adopted.

Trials.

Patrolman Conrad Joeckel, Central District, was tried upon and found guilty of charges, as follows, ordered transferred to B. Division Northeastern District and warned:

C h a r g e s :

Neglect of duty by failing to return from dinner to the corner of Howard & Fayette sts., until 3:50 p.m., being 50 minutes late, also being asleep in lunch room, 25 N. Howard street, while on active duty on July 13, 1910.

Neglect of duty by not returning to corner of Howard & Fayette streets, at 3 p.m., returned at 5:05 p.m., also being at home asleep while on active duty on July 14, 1910.

Patrolman George A. Hauf, Western District, was tried upon and found guilty of charge, as follows, and ordered deprived of ten days' leave of absence.

C h a r g e :

Neglect of duty, in failing to detect the sale of intoxicating liquor (to wit Lager Beer), without a license at premises of William Chew, c, 632 Vine street, while detailed to watch for violations of the Sunday Liquor Law, at the saloon of one Frank Germershausen, 630 Vine street, on Sunday, July 10, 1910.

Patrolman James L. Roche, Western District, was tried upon charge, as follows:-

CONDUCT UNBECOMING AN OFFICER:

First.....In that he in the month of April, 1909, demanded and received from Philip Fine, 9 N. Pine street, the sum of one dollar for advising Kitty Barber, a prostitute, then living at 649 Raborg street, to pay her indebtedness to the said Philip Fine.
