

Detective Charles H. Weaver testified, as follows:-

On Tuesday night Detective Davis and I were detailed by the Marshal of Police and Captain McGovern to watch Lee's place on Guilford avenue & Chase street. We went out there and secreted ourselves opposite Lee's place until about 12:40 a.m. He came down Chase street and tried the front door; he stayed there about five minutes and then went to the side door. He took a key out of his pocket and opened the side door. He returned and stood in front of the building again. He stayed in front a few minutes and went back into the side door, walked right in and stayed there six minutes. He came out and walked to Chase & Calvert streets. We followed him and kept him in sight. He turned down Calvert street and when he got to the next corner Mr. Davis and I called for him to come back. He asked us what we wanted him for and we told him to go to Headquarters with us. He asked what for and we told him that we would tell him when we got down town. On our way down we explained to him that we had caught him in Lee's place. He asked to let him get rid of a bottle he had in his pocket. We said no, but he threw the bottle in the street. I do not know what the bottle contained. He said "here is all I got, he opened his pocket book and took out a dollar and two nickels. He wanted to give the money to Mr. Lee, but Mr. Lee refused to take it. On our way down when near the Mercy Hospital he handed the money to Mr. Davis. The money was marked. Mr. Davis marked the money with Mr. Lee.

Q;- Had you received any report about money being missing?

A;- Yes sir, the Marshal told us he believed that Lee had been robbed several times.

Mr. Harry G. Lee, 1047 Guilford avenue, testified:

"I have missed money there several times, and made a complaint to Headquarters about it.

Q;- How long had you been missing money?

A;- Not very long. I missed some stuff there sometime ago, but suspected bar-tenders. I ran that down and discovered that they had taken the stuff.

Q;- How long ago was this?

A;- Sometime ago.

Q;- Has it been a year?
