He was in there six minutes and started to come out, someone was going down Chase street at that moment Dorsey saw him and stepped back. He waited until the man got across the bridge, then he came out and locked the door. Coming down he said "My God, let me get rid of this bottle." We told him he could not get rid of it, but he finally threw the bottle away. It broke. I do not know what was in the bottle. Mr. Lee saw him get in from the Biddle street bridge. He said to Mr. Lee, this is all I have taken one dollar and ten cents. Mr. Lee did not take the money.
