Children's Play Ground Association.

Miss Mary B. Stewart and Mr. John A. Muir, representing the Children's Play Ground Association, called upon the Board in relation to the use of the streets in certain localities for the purpose of playing games in which a large inflated soft ball is employed; the said games being under the direction of the Children's Play Ground Association in the general scheme of the work of said association. Miss Stewart stated to the Board that one of the points is at Columbia avenue and Greene street and that the Police had stopped the game as in violation of the law. She asked that such games be permitted, the ball used being of such a character as that no harm to person or property could result from its use.

The Board expressed itself as willing to take a liberal view of the matter.

The Marshal was called in and Miss Stewart and Mr. Muir were turned over to him with a view of arriving at some satisfactory understanding whereby the game mentioned may be permitted at given locations, unless complaints are made against them.
