The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

Relative to the attached communication from Octavia Johnson, 525 Biddle alley, in which it is alleged that Patrolman Walter E. Boone, Northwestern District, arrested her and her daughter without just cause, also that Patrolman Boone visits house #529 Biddle alley, I beg, respectfully, to state that I detailed Detective George W. Armstrong to make an investigation and his report in connection therewith is hereto annexed.

It will be noted from the statement of Octavia Johnson as contained in Detective Armstrong's report, that the letter written to your Honorable Body by Octavia Johnson was done in a spirit of revenge and that the allegations made therein were untrue. I would therefore respectfully recommend that the complaint of Octavia Johnson be filed without further action.
