

state that I took this matter up with the various Captains, all of whom (with the exception of Captain Moxley) are of the opinion that the Maryland Telephone can be dispensed with, as the majority of telephonic communications are over the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone.

I would therefore recommend that all Maryland Telephones be discontinued in the department. I would further recommend, however, that the Maryland Telephone now located at Police Headquarters be retained as occasions might arise whereby this department could be reached over this phone only.
