I would therefore, recommend that he be cited before your Honorable Body upon charges of neglect of duty.

As to property 200 W. Lafayette avenue, I had Patrolman William H. Kelly, Northwestern District, before me, and he stated that he did not remember receiving instructions over the desk about four or five weeks ago to visit the yards of places on his post in order to ascertain whether or not the Mosquito Ordinance was being enforced, he, however, stated that he had inspected the cellar of this property. I would respectfully recommend that he be brought before your Honorable Body upon charges.

As to property, 2136 Bolton street, I had Patrolman Abbott L. McLain, Northern District, before me and he states that he had received orders about enforcing the Mosquito Ordinance about four weeks ago and that he visited this property on Tuesday, August 2nd.; his prior visit being about three weeks previous. I would also recommend in this case that Patrolman McLain be cited before your Honorable Body upon charges.
