

Appointment of Probationer.

Charles L. Tunstall, nominated by the Board of Police Examiners, under date of December 29th., 1906, who was rejected by the Board of Police Commissioners January 14, 1907, and re-instated to eligible list January 14, 1910, as referred to in the proceedings of the last named date, having passed the required physical re-examination, July 12, 1910, and having been reported upon favorably, was appointed a probationer; vice probationer Henry A. Busky, appointed a patrolman.

Traffic Regulations, - Enforcement of.
