

Justice Jacob Rab to the Northeastern District Station-house, to sit thereat from 8 a.m., August 13 th., to 11 a.m. August 14th., 1910, in the place of Justice William J. 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Grand Jury, - Cocaine Cases.

In view of the statements appearing in the press of August 10th., and to-day, in which it is alleged that Foreman Cassard of the Grand Jury criticises the Board of Police Commissioners for supposed inactivity on its part with respect to information said to have been given by Mr. Cassard to the Board of official misconduct charged against members of the force, in connection with the illegal sale of cocaine,

The Marshal was called in before the Board and instruted to visit the Grand Jury and request that body to give the Board the names of the officers Mr. Cassard had in mind, as above referred to, as well as the time place and character of wrong-doing specifically, and the names and addresses of any witnesses in the premises, in order that the Board may investigate and prefer charges against any offending officers.

The Marshal returned and reported, verbally, that he had been before the Grand Jury and made the request as instructed by the Board; that he had been sent out of the room that the Grand Jury might discuss the matter and afterwards recalled, but that he had been unable to get from the Grand Jury the information sought by the Board; that the only message for delivery to the Board he received was, that the Board had the same information the Grand Jury had. The Marshal stated to the Board that he would try to get in touch with Foreman Cassard after the adjournment of the Grand Jury, and see if he could not secure the information desired.
