Jail Van Service Discontinued.

Upon the recommendation of the Lieutenant of Mounted Police, approved by the Marshal, it was ordered that horse jail van service be discontinued on and after Thursday next, August 18, 1910, and that:

Persons committed to jail from the Central District be conveyed there in the Central District Auto Patrol Wagon;

All persons committed to the House of Correction be conveyed from jail to Camden station every Tuesday and Friday mornings by the Central District Auto Patrol Wagon.

That persons committed to Jail from the Southern and Southwestern Districts be conveyed there in the Southern District Auto patrol wagon.
