The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

In connection with the attached communication from Mr. J.G.Holmes, claiming remuneration for loss of time sustained by him due to effecting the arrest of George Williams, charged with snatching a satchel from Mrs. Annie Armiger, and which necessitated his presence at the Station-house, Grand Jury and Court.

I referred this matter to Captain J.E.Moxley, Northern District, for investigation and report, and which report is also herewith. In addition to this report I learned from the office of the Clerk of the Criminal Court that Holmes appeared before the Grand Jury on June 5th., and 11th.

In view of the services rendered by Mr. Holmes in affecting the arrest, as well as the conviction of Williams, I would respectfully recommend that his claim of \$6.70 be allowed by your Honorable Body.
