Gentlemen:-

On July 10th. last, Harvey Thomas Bond, made a statement to me with reference to his arrest by Patrolman William H. McKew, S.D., which is herewith enclosed. I forwarded this statement to the Commanding officer of the Southern District for attention. The result of this investigation is contained in the statements of Sergt. Edward Schulte and Patrolman Wm. H. McKew and Patrolman John H. Dull.
