To the Honorable,

The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

At your request, we sent Mr. Wm. L. Hooper, Auditor in this Department to examine and check up the accounts of your Board for the six months ending June 30th., and his report is as follows:

"I have to report that pursuant to instructions I have made a careful and thorough examination into the accounts of the Treasurer of the Board of Police Commissioners, including the General Fund, the Special Fund and the Incidental Fund, comparing receipts and disbursements with vouchers, and I find that the said accounts are correct in every particular from January 1, 1911, to and including June 30, 1911.

In addition I would say I have verified the balance of funds held in depositories for account of the Board of Police Commissioners up to and including June 30, 1911.
