Re. Arrest of Joseph Berryman for Assault
on Mrs. Mary E. Cairnes.

The Marshal submitted report, as follows:-

"Central District, July 18, 1911.

To Thomas F. Farnan, Marshal,

Sir:-

About 10:40 a.m., a white man came to the Wentworth Apartments, S.E. corner Cathedral & Mulberry streets, and was taken to the third floor on the elevator. He went to Apartment D., occupied by Mrs. Mary E. Cairnes, and said he wanted to look at the telephone. Mrs. Cairnes told him where it was in the bed room. As she turned her back he grabbed her around the neck, choking her and tried to place a gag in her mouth; at the sametime said he wanted her money. Mrs. Cairnes screamed and fought him and he ran out. He was followed by Richard Cres, the janitor, who chased him until he reached Calvert & Saratoga streets, where he was caught and placed under arrest by Round Sergeant Thomas McGraw.

At the station-house he gave the name of Joseph Berryman, 2528 Madison avenue.
