

sidewalk so that the same was obstructed on the 28th. day of July, 1911 and that said charge was heard at the Western Police Station on the 29th. day of July, 1911, whereupon Justice Loden dismissed the same with Costs.

Second, That immediately following said dismissal on the day aforesaid the said officer preceeded the said Shanks to his said place of business (4 N. Poppleton street), and before the said Shanks could remove his said goods from the street and highway the said officer did illegally, wantonly and maliciously arrest the said Shanks on a false and malicious charge from which on the 30th. day of July, 1911, at the hearing thereof the said Justice Loden dismissed the said Shanks.

Third, That said arrests were made on account of malice and were without any just or reasonable provocation, but were from motives of malice and ill will on the part of the said Officer McManus.

Fourth, That on or about the 14th. day of January, 1911, the said Officer McManus demanded and upon said demand obtained from the said Shanks two chairs, and that the said "officer" received the said chairs and the said Shanks gave the same with the understanding that he would obtain the good will of the said officer, and that the understanding was between the said Shanks and McManus that the said chairs were never to be paid for.

Fifth, That on and about the fourth day of July, 1911 and for certain and several days prior and subsequent thereto the said officer made certain and several demands upon the said Shanks that he should give to the said officer a suit case so that he could use the same and have it for his own property and that the understanding was that the said suit case was not to be paid for by the said officer, and that the said Shanks refused this said demand, and that thereupon the demeanor of the said officer changed, and he acted as has been above described in the first and second paragraphs of these charges, all the while during said arrest so made, reminding and threatening the said Shanks in the following manner and words "I'll get even with you", and I'am a bad man when I get started".

Wherefore your petitioner the said Samuel Shanks prays that he may be allowed to present himself with his witnesses before this Board and prosecute said charges.
