Communication from Miss Charlotte Nicolai.

In the matter of the communication from Miss Charlotte Nicolai in respect to contributions for the benefit of the Eudowood Tuberculosis Hospital, as referred to in the proceedings of July 13, 1911, a report, as follows, was received from the Marshal:-

"Baltimore, Md., August 16th., 1911.

To The Honorable,

The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

I beg to submit, herewith, reports of the various districts with respect to members of the department contributing towards the benefits of the Eudowood Tuberculosis Hospital.

From these reports I gather that the districts are evenly divided as to how this fund should be collected and disposed of, namely:

To contribute ten cents monthly, and the same to be turned over to the Eudowood Tuberculosis Hospital:

Northern District.....	45
Central District.....	182
Southern District.....	89
Southwestern District.....	55

To contrubute ten cents monthly when the necessity arises for the admission of a member of the department to Eudowood Tuberculosis, or any other hospital, and that this fund be kept in reserve by the Board of Police Commissioners.

Western District.....	<u>90.</u>
