Gentlemen:-

In connection with the enclosed communication from Mr. Ludwig Andzefefsky and in which he makes complaint as to the arrest of his wife on August 2nd., last, I beg, respectfully, to state that I referred this matter to Captain George League, Eastern District, for investigation, the result of which is contained in a statement hereto attached.

It will be noted from this statement that Mrs. Andzefefsky is a troublesome character and in my judgment Patrolman Lisiecki was fully justified in arresting her. I would therefore respectfully recommend that the complaint of Mr. Andzefefsky be ignored and filed.
