Complaint against

A communication, as follows, was received, and it was
ordered that Captain Charles W. Gittings be cited before the
Board upon charges based upon the complaint made by Mr. Henderson,

I wish to prefer charges against Captain Charles
Gittings of the Northeastern District, because of his manner
