Resignation.

Patrolman John M. Kehl, N.E. District.

In the matter of Patrolman John M. Kehl of the Northeastern District, against whom charges of having failed to send in report call, September 3, 1911, and of having failed to report for duty at 7 p.m., September 3, 1911, were pending, the Marshal reported to the Board, through the Secretary:
