Cramblitt.

In the matter of complaint preferred by John B. Cramblitt vs. Probationer George Belz, as contained in letter addressed to the Marshal of Police September 14, 1911, a report, as follows, was received, read and ordered filed without further action:

"Baltimore, Md., September 18th., 1911.

To The Honorable,

The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

Referring to the attached complaint of John B. Cramblitt with respect to the conduct of Officer #509 (Probationer George Belz, Western District) while having under arrest one William Carroll on the evening of September 9th., 1911.

I referred this matter to Captain Morheiser for investigation. From Captain Morheiser's report, which is herewith, my judgment is that Probationer Belz was fully justified in his actions towards the prisoner, especially as Carroll, the prisoner, has quite a police record (as will be noted from the attached memo.) and has always been regarded as a dangerous man.

I would respectfully recommend that this complaint be filed without further action.
