Ballot Boxes.
Eighth Precinct, - Twenty-third Ward.
Order of Court.

Mr. Alonzo L. Miles, Counsel of the Board, appeared before the Board and informed it that he had just come from a conference between His Honor, Judge Henry Duffy, presiding in the Criminal Court, State's Attorney, Albert S.J.Owens, Mr. Edgar F. Dobson, Foreman of the Grand Jury, Mr. Harry Nice, member of the Board of Supervisors of Election, Mr. W. S. Gebhart, counsel of the said Board, and others; that Judge Henry Duffy had passed an order, directed to the Board of Police Commissioners, for the production before the Grand Jury, at noon to-day, of the ballot boxes used in the eighth precinct of the twenty-third ward, in the primary election held in Baltimore City, August 29th., 1911; that he, Mr. Miles, had, at the said conference, accepted service for the Board, of the said order. Mr. Miles handed the Board a certified copy of Judge Duffy's order, the said order being as follows:-

O R D E R E D, By the Criminal Court of Baltimore, this 22nd., day of September, 1911, on the Report and Petition of the Grand Jury of the City of Baltimore, filed in this Court on September 21st., 1911, that the Board of Supervisors of Election of Baltimore City, and the Board of Police Commissioners of Baltimore City, be, and they are, hereby directed to produce before the Grand Jury of said City, at 12 o'clock noon on the 22nd. day of September, 1911, the Ballot Boxes of the Eighth Precinct of the Twenty-third Ward of the City of Baltimore, used in the Primary Election held in said City on the 29th. day of August, 1911, together with the keys thereof, and that the seals thereof shall be broken in said Grand Jury Room in the presence of one member of each of said Boards and the same shall be there unlocked by the Foreman of the Grand Jury and the contents thereof examined by said Grand Jury to the fullest extent that to them may seem necessary,
