Whelple and Tome.The minutes of the previous meeting, Thursday, September 28, 1911,were read, approved and adopted.Ballot Boxes.Investigation by Grand Jury.Election - August 29, 1911.

An order, as follows, was received and the Marshal of Police and the Secretary of the Board were directed to jointly see that the ballot boxes used in the primary election, August 29, 1911, be produced before the Grand Jury as desired by that body in compliance with the terms of said order:

ORDERED, by the Criminal Court of Baltimore, this twenty-ninth day of September, 1911, upon the Petition of the Grand Jury of the City of Baltimore, filed in this Court on September 29th., 1911, that the Board of Supervisors of Elections of Baltimore City, and the Board of Police Commissioners of Baltimore City, be, and they are, hereby directed to produce before the Grand Jury of said City, all of the ballot boxes used in the City of Baltimore in the Primary Election held in said city, on the 29th. day of August, 1911, together with the keys thereof, for all precincts not heretofore produced in consequence of the orders of this Court passed prior hereto, the said ballot boxes to be produced before the said Grand Jury in such numbers, and at such times as the Foreman and Members of the said Grand Jury shall direct; and that the seals thereon shall be broken in said Grand Jury Room in the presence of one member of each of said Boards and the same shall be there unlocked by the Foreman of the Grand Jury and the contents thereof examined by said Grand Jury to the fullest extent that to them may seem necessary, and the ballots therein fully counted, and such notes and memoranda made by said Grand Jury as may by that body be deemed necessary as to all the contents of said Boxes, that the contents shall then be returned to said Boxes which shall be locked by the Foreman of the Grand
