

mary held in the City of Baltimore on the 4th. day of April, 1911, and in addition thereto the returns and result of the municipal election held in the said City of Baltimore on the 2nd. day of May, 1911.

Second: That the period specified in Section 76 of Article 33 of the Public General Laws of Maryland, entitled Elections, during which the Board of Police Commissioners can retain the custody and control of the ballot boxes used containing the ballots cast and poll books, also the custody of the tallies and statements or returns of the said municipal primary and election, is six months and that the said period will expire as to the said municipal election on the 2nd. day of November, 1911, and that upon the expiration of the said period of six months the Board of Supervisors of Elections are required by the Section hereinbefore referred to, to destroy the said ballots, poll books, tallies and statements or returns.

Third: In order that the investigation of the returns of the said municipal primary and the said municipal election may be properly conducted, it is necessary that the said ballots, poll books, tallies and statements or returns be retained in their original condition in the custody of the Board of Police Commissioners of Baltimore City until such time as this Grand Jury may complete its investigation of the primary election, held in the City of Baltimore on August 29th., 1911, and have opportunity to begin and carry on the investigation designed to be made of the said municipal primary and municipal election.

WHEREFORE, this jury respectfully prays this Honorable Court to pass an order, directed to the Board of Supervisors of Elections of Baltimore City, and to each of the members of said Board, to wit, Charles H. Carter, Harry W. Nice and Max Ways, and to the said Board of Police Commissioners, and to each of the members of said Board of Police Commissioners, to wit, John B.A. Whelple, Peter E. Tome and C. Baker Clotworthy, requiring and directing the said Board of Supervisors of Elections of the City of Baltimore, and the said Board of Police Commissioners of Baltimore City, to retain custody of the said ballot boxes used, the ballots cast and the poll books, tallies and statements or returns in the said municipal primary and in the said municipal election, until the further order of this Court.
