

each of the several captains to cause their subordinates to familiarize themselves with these instructions and obey them strictly; that special attention be called to the provisions therein requiring the police to be careful to observe the actions of the election officials and to report any fraudulent conduct on the part of any election official which may come to their knowledge in any manner whatever.

And it was ordered that the attention of the force be especially called to the instructions in the pamphlet referred to relating to the rights of challengers to be present in the polling room from the time of the opening of the polls until the completion of the count of the ballots with full opportunity to see that the judges and clerks are faithfully performing their duties. Watchers and challengers must be protected in the discharge of their duties by the police, but no watcher or challenger has the right to handle any ballots during the election or count of ballots, or undertake to perform the duties of the election officials, or to inquire or ascertain for what candidate or candidates any voter may intend to vote or has voted, or to confer in the polling room with any voter, or to assist any voter in the preparation of his ballot.

The Board of Police Commissioners directs the attention of all keepers of places where intoxicating liquors are sold to the provisions of Sections 682 and 685 of Article 4, Public Local Laws, (Charter), which forbid the selling or furnishing of intoxicating liquor to any person on any days upon which elections are required by law to be held, under penalty of fine of \$100 to \$500 for the first offense; revocation of license and fine of \$500. to \$1,000. or imprisonment in jail or House of Correction three to twelve months, or both, for second offense.

Note: Election day means from midnight on the previous day to
