C h a r g e s :

CONDUCT UNBECOMING AN OFFICER:

1st.....By being under the influence of liquor while not on active duty, on Wednesday, October 18th., 1911.

2nd.....By acting in a disorderly manner in the neighborhood of 1543 Friendsbury Place on Wednesday, October 18th., 1911, not being on active duty."

In view of the extremely provoking actions on the part of the family of Patrolman Slaine, about the date referred to, and the mitigating circumstances surrounding the conduct of Patrolman Slaine, as charged, the Board acquitted him of the charges, but ordered that the said Patrolman John F.
