Bawdy-houses.  
Eastern and Canton Avenues.

Recommendation, as follows, was received, read and approved:

To The Honorable,

The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

Complaint has been made to me as to the existence of bawdy-houses on Eastern and Canton avenues, between Eden and Bond streets.

It is alleged that the houses on Eastern Avenue between Caroline and Bond streets are a menace to good morals, especially on account of the street cars running pass their doors.

I would therefore recommend that an order be issued requiring all occupants of bawdy-houses on Eastern avenue between Eden and Bond streets, be required to remove to some side or adjoining street which is not traversed by a car line.
