Southern District Station-house.
Re-Wiring.

The Consolidated Gas Electric Light & Power Company having been notified by the city authorities to remove certain of its poles and wires and to use the city conduits instead, and which change necessitates the re-wiring of the Southern District Station-house in part, as referred to in the following letter, authority was given to make the necessary changes; cost of same to be approximately, \$70.

Sir:-

The Consolidated Gas, Electric Light & Power Co. have notified this department that they are about to change their Lighting Circuit from the present overhead two-wire system, to the underground three wire system at the Southern Police Station. By so doing it will necessitate the purchase of a new Twelve Circuit Table Board; also rewire the lower part of the building. The material to make this change will cost about \$70.
