In reference to the attached reports about a collision between Car #21 of the United Railways & Electric Co., and the Central District auto patrol, on November 14, 1911, I find upon investigation that the auto patrol being driven by Driver Edward Dougherty, who is learning to run an automobile, was returning from a call at Pratt & Frederick sts., and while bound north on Frederick st., and in attempting to cross Lombard st., Car #21 without any signal or warning of its approach, ran into the automobile patrol, making a slight scratch on the corner of the automobile body and breaking the fender of the car.
