"Southern District, November 25, 1911.

Thomas F. Farnan, Marshal of Police.

Sir:-

About 11 o'clock p.m., November 25, 1911, I was going west on Cross st., and when I got in front of McMahon's saloon, #5 E. Cross street, I heard a pistol shot and glass breaking, and a crowd rushing out of the place. I made my way through the crowd and saw Richard Welsh rushing out of the saloon with blood running down his hand. I placed him under arrest and turned him over to Officer John W. Garrett who had arrived on the scene. I then went into the saloon to look for the person who had done the shooting, but he had gone out of the back way, and I heard someone in the crowd say that McNeal had done the shooting, but could not tell who the one was that made the remark. I then searched the house but was unable to find the man. Welsh said he did not know who shot him, but on information received from Officer George R. Lookingland I gave orders to the men to pick McNeal up, but they did not come across him and at 12:50 this a.m., McNeal came into the station and gave himself up and Lieut. League relieved him of his equipments and charged him with Disorderly Conduct.

McNeal and Welsh were brought before Justice Lewis this a.m., and were released on \$26.45 for a hearing November 27, 1911, 8 a.m.

Welsh stated before Justice Lewis that he would not prefer any charge against McNeal as it was an accident.

I could not get any witnesses to the fight that was supposed to have occurred before the shot was fired.
