Grand Jury.
Captain Thomas B. McGee.

In the matter of the statement issued by the Grand Jury, as published in the evening press of November 17, 1911, in which Captain Thomas B. McGee of the Southwestern District, is criticised as an improper custodian of ballot boxes, it was ordered:

That Mr. Alonzo L. Miles, Counsel of the Board, be requested to confer with the State's Attorney and arrange to petition the Court to furnish the Board with a full copy of Captain McGee's testimony before the Grand Jury, with permission to make an additional copy thereof for the use of the Board.

And, in addition it was ordered that the testimony of Captain Jonathan E. Moxley of the Northern District, given before the Grand Jury on the same day which Captain McGee appeared before that body be also obtained.
