In the matter of the complaint of Mrs. Mary Hendrix, 2003 Clifton avenue, against Patrolmen Charles Scheib and Edward J. Talbott, of the Northwestern District, as referred to in the proceedings of November 20, 1911, a statement was received from Patrolman Talbott, as directed by the Board.

It was ordered that Patrolman Charles Scheib and Edward J. Talbott be cited before the Board on charges based on the complaint of Mrs. Hendrix, and Thursday, December 14, 1911, was set for a hearing thereof. (See Exhibit No. 3663.)

Private Stands for Hackney Carriages.  
Emerson Hotel.

Upon the application of the Emerson Hotel Company, and under and by virtue of the authority conferred by Chapter 109, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, 1910, the Board designated as a private stand for hackney carriages the roadway on the west side of Calvert street in front of the Emerson Hotel, between Baltimore street and Bank Lane; the understanding being that there shall not be at one time more than four such hackney carriages using the said private stand; two north of the entrance of said hotel and two south of the said entrance; that the management of the Hotel Emerson shall have the right to designate what hackney carriages shall occupy the said private stand.
