Members of the department are instructed to enforce this regulation strictly.

That the Round Sergeants in each district shall personally call upon the proprietor or manager of each garage in their district, leave with each a copy of the instructions, calling attention especially to the requirements therein referred to; that the Round Sergeants shall report to their respective captains the name of person with whom the circular was left, the location of the garage and the date the circular was left, in order that the captain may transmit the same for the files at Headquarters.
