Horse, - Death of.

Report, as follows, was received, read and ordered filed, see Exhibit No. 3667:

"Mounted Service, November 28, 1911.

Thomas F. Farnan, Marshal of Police.

Sir:-

I respectfully report that saddle horse #58, suffering from a rupture of the intestines, for which there is no cure, was killed by Dr. Byrnes, yesterday afternoon, at the yard at the Mounted Stable.

This horse was taken sick last Friday evening, about 6:15 p.m., and Dr. Byrnes was called to attend him.

This horse was bought from James King, April 6th., 1907, at a cost of \$187.50, and has been working under the saddle ever since.
