So under all the circumstances the Board very respectfully asks your Excellency if some arrangement cannot be made, - in the event Captain Coster dies of his wounds, - by which on short notice, one of the vessels of the State Oyster Police can be had to effect the arrest of Captain Dixon who, being an employe of that service as before referred to, can easily be located by it.
