

Take up wagons only within four or five squares of a dealers Yard.

When the gross weight is ascertained, officer should follow up team until light weight is gotten.

Wagon should not be taken up, if immediately in front of customers house for whom coal is intended.

Do not exempt wagon on account of being full, as some such wagons are shortest in weight.

Notify dealer when his wagon is about to be weighed, as it should be weighed in his presence.

The Board promised the delegation that it would instruct the Marshal to carry out the suggestion of the Coal Dealers Exchange as far as it might be possible to do so, reminding the delegation that if in the indiscriminate picking up of coal carts any disadvantage should accrue to any member of the exchange because of suspicion cast upon him in the picking up of his cart the Exchange will have to assume the blame, if any arise under the circumstances.
