Board of Police Commissioners.

Dear Sirs:

At the City-wide Congress last evening, the following resolution was adopted unanimously, showing that the civic conscience is awake to a degree that should make the "next step" in the suppression of social vice a certainty:-

RESOLVED:- That the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City and the Police Commissioners be urged to put in force the following:-

No woman not now a regular inmate of a house of prostitution (and known to the police to be such) shall be allowed to enter a house of prostitution for immoral purposes; any violation of the same to be punished by the imprisonment of the keeper of the house.
