I respectfully recommend that an automobile be purchased for my use. My reason for this recommendation is that I am at present using a horse and rockaway and as I have to cover a great deal of ground each day, the department should provide a more up-to-date way of getting around, as each day I lose much valuable time.

The Walker Auto Co. will furnish a new 1912, "Cole" Automobile, fully equipped and guaranteed for one year, for the sum of \$2,000.

The regular price is \$2,280.

The Lozier Sales Company offers to furnish a second-hand 1910 "Locomobile", fully equipped and guaranteed to be in first-class condition, for the sum of \$1,650.

Messrs. Callahan, Atkinson & Co., offer to furnish a second hand "Locomobile", now being used at Headquarters, after thoroughly overhauling same and with a guarantee for one year, for the sum of \$1800., and will put a larger body on it for \$200. additional.

Messrs. Carl Spoerer & Sons Co., have a five passenger, second hand 1910 "Spoerer" automobile, which they will sell with a guarantee for one year for the sum of \$1,900.
