The detective service above set out was not required to obtain testimony regarding the character, habits, mode of life and criminal record of Marie Golder, alias M. Lyons, alias Schallanburg upon whose charges the accusation was filed and for the same purpose as to Dr. J.H. Williams, alias Wilson, alias Golder, and to obtain the necessary testimony in the defense of your petitioner.

ELEVENTH, This honorable Board can see that such an expense imposed upon a member of the Police Force is a hardship and compels him to spend in a large measure the savings which he has accumulated from his pay.

Wherefore your Petitioner prays that this Board will allow him the aforesaid sum so that he shall not have been put to the expense of \$537.00 to establish his innocence without receiving just compensation therefore.

Inasmuch as Sergeant Frank J.
