Presentation.

Marshal Thomas F. Farnan.

Deputy Marshal James Manning appeared before the Board and stated that he had obtained letter addressed by His Eminence J. Cardinal Gibbons to Bernard Carter, Esq., on the occasion of the presentation by the citizens of Baltimore, of a gold badge to Marshal Thomas F. Farnan, May 4th., 1911. (See proceedings of May 8, 1911)

That he, the Deputy Marshal, had had this communication suitably framed and desired to present the letter in this shape to Marshal Farnan as a Christmas remembrance. He asked that the Board suspend in this instance the rule of the Department against the making of Christmas presents to superior officers.

The Board heartily approved of the presentation of the letter referred to and suspended, with pleasure, the rule on the subject, as requested by the Deputy Marshal.

Social Evil.

Bawdy Houses, - Regulations.

It was ordered that paragraph, as follows, be included in the regulations with respect to bawdy houses, as recorded in the minutes of December 11, 1911:

"No person will be allowed to keep, manage or have a pecuniary interest in more than one bawdy house or other house used for purposes of prostitution." (See Exhibit NO. 3690.)

Requisition.

Requisition No. 909, was drawn on the Mayor and City Council for \$64,140.92, to pay the salaries of the Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Secretary to Marshal, Counsel, Chief Police Physician and four Police Physicians, for the month of December, 1911; to
