

OFFICE OF THEBOARD OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS.Court - House.Baltimore, Md., Tuesday, December 26, 1911.Board met; present, Mess. Whelple, Clotworthy & Tome.The minutes of the previous meeting, Thursday, December 21, 1911,  
were read, approved and adopted.Trials.Dismissal.

In the matter of Probationer Owen A. Martin of the Western District, who was tried December 21, 1911, upon charge, as follows:

"Reporting at the Western Police Station-house at 8:40 a.m., December 19, 1911, under the influence of intoxicating liquor, to appear before the Magistrate in the case of Alexander Kirby."

Probationer Owen A. Martin was found guilty of the foregoing charge and dismissed from the force.

The vote upon the finding in the case of Probationer Owen A. Martin and the dismissal of the said Martin from the force, was:

President Whelple.....Yea,

Commissioner Clotworthy.....Yea,

Commissioner Tome.....Yea.

Patrolman Harry C. Kirby, Southern District, reported for having been sixteen minutes behind his squad, coming in off duty and asleep on his post, December 24, 1911, was excused.

Patrolman Abbott L. McLain, Northern District, was before the Board upon charge, as follows:-

CONDUCT UNBECOMING AN OFFICER:

"In that he at 8:15 p.m., December 22nd., 1911, while in the Northern Police Station-house, used to Captain Jonathan E. Moxley, improper language, as follows:

"How much longer is this 8 o'clock business going to last; I think it a dam outrage; there is other districts where pocket-books are being snatched - Southwestern and Northeastern; and I think it is a dam outrage and a raw deal; someone ought to take it up."

Patrolman McLain requested that the hearing of this charge be postponed until January 2, 1912, on account, he said, of the absence of his counsel from the city.
