

Retirement.Patrolman Andrew J. Taylor, Northern District.

Report, as follows, was received:

"Baltimore, December 22nd., 1911.

To The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

In compliance with your instructions of December 22nd., 1911, we have made a thorough medical examination of Andrew J. Taylor, Patrolman of the Baltimore Police Force, and find that he is permanently incapable of performing active police duty, being disabled by reason of chronic plurisy, chronic rheumatism, defective vision and hearing.
