Jail, - Conveying Prisoners to.

Pursuant to the Board's instructions of December 18, 1911, a report, as follows, was received from the Marshal:-

"Baltimore, Md., December 26th., 1911.

To The Honorable,

The Board of Police Commissioners.

Gentlemen:-

In connection with all police automobiles being at the Jail at one time delivering prisoners, I would respectfully recommend the adoption of the following arrangement, namely, that the

EASTERN DISTRICT automobile convey their own prisoners and the Northeastern Districts to Jail.

NORTHERN DISTRICT automobile convey their own as well as the Central District's prisoners to Jail.

NORTHWESTERN DISTRICT automobile to convey their own prisoners as the Western District's to Jail.
