Transfers.

It was ordered that Patrolman Frederick N. Fanning, North-eastern District, be transferred therefrom to the Southwestern District, instead of the Western District, as previously ordered.

Upon the applications of the officers themselves it was ordered that transfers, as follows, be made, to take effect at once, viz:

Patrolman John C. Wilkins from the Southern to the North-eastern District, vice Fanning.

Patrolman John F. Coffey from the Southwestern to the North-eastern District; vice Halleron.

Probationer Joseph G. Reilly from the Northwestern to the Central District; vice Durfee, promoted.

Patrolman Jeremiah A. Lynch from the Northern to the North-western District; vice Callahan.

Appointment of Special Officer.

Upon the application of the Belvedere Hotel Company and by virtue of authority conferred by Chapter 471 of the Acts of 1906, John J. Keating was re-appointed a Special Police Officer for duty in and about the Belvedere Hotel; said appointment to be for one year unless sooner revoked.
