Patrolman Harry H. Shook.

In the matter of Patrolman Harry H. Shook, Northwestern District, who disappeared from his home May 18th., last, as referred to in the proceedings of May 20th., 23rd., 28th., and June 3rd., 1912, and who was tried upon the charge of absenting himself from duty without permission, as recorded in the proceedings of May 31, 1912, report, as follows, was received from the Police Physicians:-

Gentlemen:-

At a full meeting of the Board of Police Physicians, Patrolman Harry H. Shook was carefully examined and found to be mentally and physically sound.

According to statements of this officer, he was suffering at the time of his having left town, with severe pains on the right side of his neck and swelling of the glands. This statement is confirmed by the matron of the Northwestern District Station-house. She also stated he acted like a sick man. While mental aberration might occur from such condition, this Board cannot certify that he was irresponsible.
